Concerns were around the possibilities for noise nuisance; additional litter; additional traffic; travellers using the site and general antisocial behaviour in general.

The people concerned wished to know what the plan was for moving forward with the site and expressed disappointment on the lack of knowledge prior to the venture starting.

Representatives from the Estate were present at the meeting and advised that the 60-day trial was to judge the suitability of the site and agreed to hold a separate meeting where concerns could be aired and also agreed to be more proactive in terms of communication moving forward.
